

COVID-19 Sanitation Plan

It is always the intent of the custodial department to have a safe and clean environment for the students and faculty to operate in. Shown below is how we will be cleaning the school facilities as we operate during this Covid-19 environment. The state has provided the construct of green, yellow and red phases as part of the restart plan. I have also used those color phases to communicate what should be expected.

Green phase:

Trash is emptied every night. Hallways are vacuumed every night. Restrooms are clean and sanitized every night. Classrooms are vacuumed every other night. Desk and chairs for both the student and the teachers are sanitized every night. Offices are vacuumed and cleaned and sanitized every other night. Front office is vacuumed, cleaned and sanitized every night. Clean and sanitize touch points throughout the building. Such as door knobs light switches

Yellow phase:

Everything in green phase plus additional sanitizing in the classrooms. Special attention will be made on the classrooms or sections of the building where Covid cases have been reported. All flat surfaces will be cleaned and sanitized. Restrooms will get a mid-day sanitation applied.

Red phase:

During red phase it is assumed that students will not be in the building. Possibly just teachers and other essential staff. When in the red phase each room is systematically deep cleaned top to bottom. Once sanitized, the doors to each of the classrooms will be marked in such a manner to alert others that the room has been sanitized prior to their entry. Depending on how long we are in a red phase, it will be necessary to re-enter any rooms that staff have gone into.

When school opens next week, additional hand sanitizing stations have been added greatly throughout all of the buildings. Teachers will be given a container of wet wipes to start the school year off. We can probably provide the teachers with a few more containers of wet wipes. At some point they will have to go to spray bottles and dry wipes for the remainder of the year. We also have hand sanitizer wipes that can be used to clean calculators and electronic devices throughout the day. Those are being distributed to the teachers and classrooms that will need them.

Access to gloves is our biggest challenge at the moment. Of course wet swipes are a problem too, but we can work around that. We are able to access other cleaning supplies and chemicals.
